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10 Best Restaurants for 1st Arrondissement:

The 1st Arrondissement is located in the very heart of Paris. It is walking distance from most tourist sites and landmarks, such as the Louvre, the Tuileries, and the Palais-Royal. In the 1st, you can find some of the finest and most luxurious restaurants in Paris, but we included some awesome affordable restaurants in our list as well.

1. L'Absinthe

While still being a casual and comfortable bistro, L'Absinthe has been taken up a few notches since it is now owned by Caroline Rostang, the daughter of the French culinary chef Michel Rostang. It is described as being similar to the New York City vibe: trendy, charming, and chic, yet traditional at the same time.

Hours: Monday - Thursday for lunch (12:00 pm - 2:15 pm) and dinner (7:00 pm - 10:15 pm). Closes at 10:45 pm on Friday and Saturday.

2. Yam'Tcha

A fusion of French and Asian cuisine, Yam'Tcha is a Michelin Star restaurant, so expect to spend some bucks. Owned by Adeline Grattard, who spent many years in Asia, the intimate dining room is decorated with tasteful Asian accents, has a calm atmosphere, and employs highly experienced chefs, making it a perfect place to eat. But do book in advance!

Hours: Wednesday - Sunday, 11:30 am - 7:30 pm. Closed Monday and Tuesday.

3. Le Meurice

Considered one of the best restaurants in Paris, Le Meurice is a Michelin 3-starred restaurant. It is a destination for gastronomes from all over the world as they tour the richness of French flavors while enjoying royal and romantic settings. Surprisingly, it is also family-friendly, loaning children custom-made boats to sail in the pond in the nearby Tuileries.

Hours: Monday - Friday for lunch (12:30 pm - 2:30 pm) and dinner (7:30 pm - 10:00 pm). Open for breakfast from 7:00 am to 10:30 am during the weekdays and from 7:00 am to 11:30 am on weekends.

4. Le First

Have lunch with a stunning view of Tuileries Jardins at Le First restaurant Boudoir! Try to book a table by the window or the outdoor terrace. The interiors are also elegantly chic. Pair that with Michelin-level dishes and you have an amazing gastronomic experience.

5. Chez Denise

This is the place to be if you like to have a good time with good company! By midnight, the place is brimming with a hungry and happy vibe. 6. L'Ardoise

Hours: Tuesday - Saturday for lunch (12:00 pm - 2:30 pm) and for dinner (7:00 pm to 11:00 pm), and Sunday for dinner only (from 7:00 pm to 11:00 pm). Closed Monday.

7. Pirouette

Unlike many restaurants that only serve specific dishes daily, Pirouette strongly promotes clients' freedom of choice. Stylish, relaxed, and with incredibly affordable prices, you will not be disappointed eating here.

Hours: Monday - Saturday for lunch (12:30 pm - 2:30 pm) and dinner (7:30 pm - 10:30 pm). Closed Sunday.

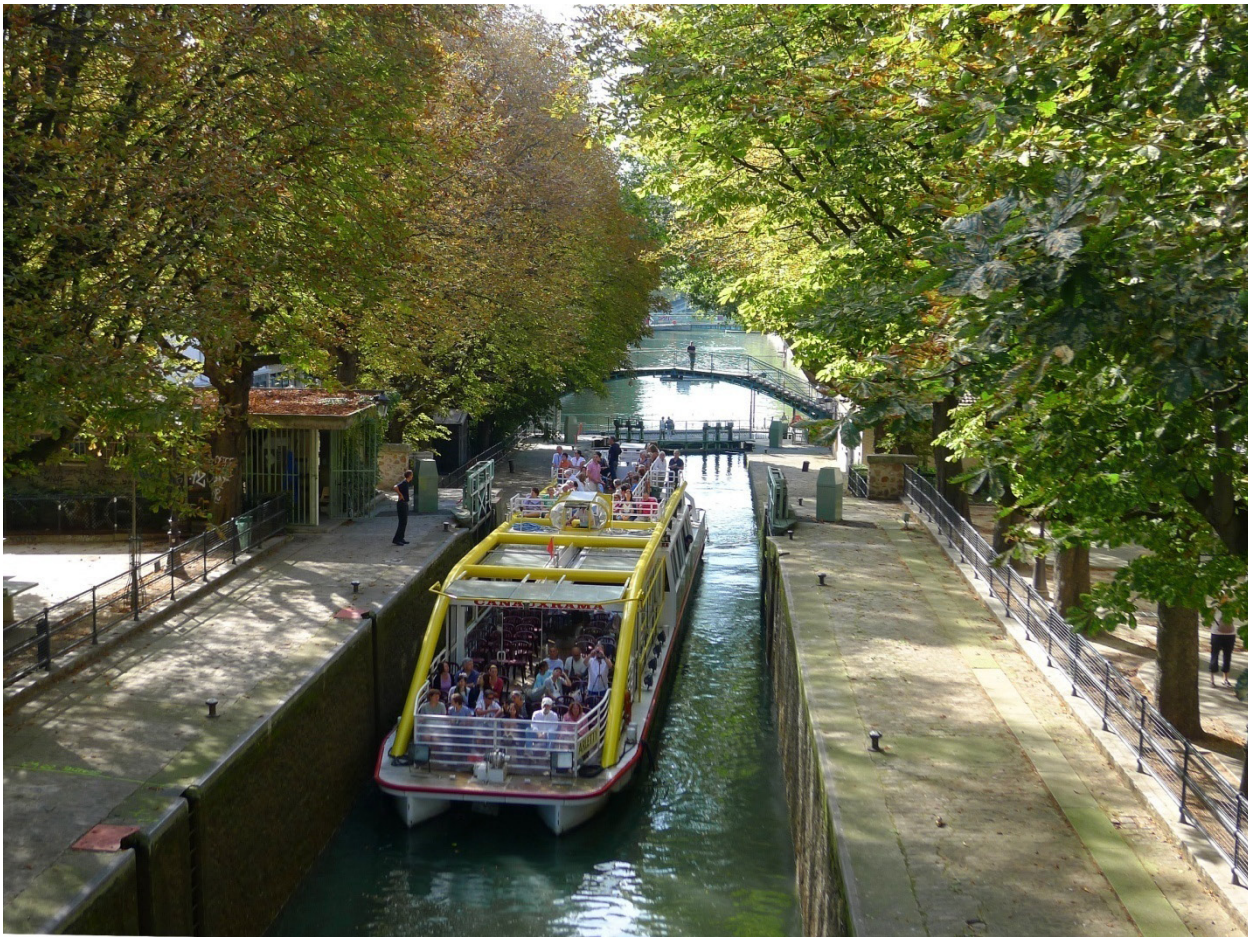
